Not impossible – but Hard

- (Heb. 3:6,12 – 14) “But Christ is faithful as the Son over God's house. And we are his house, **if** indeed we hold firmly to our **confidence** and the **hope** in which we glory...12 – 14 “Take care, brethren, that there not be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving heart that **falls away** from the living God. 13 But encourage one another day after day, as long as it is *still* called “Today,” so that none of you will be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. 14 For we have become partakers of Christ, **if** we hold fast the beginning of our assurance **firm until the end.**”

Not impossible – but Hard

- (Hebrews 6:4 – 6) “For in the case of those who have **once been enlightened** and have **tasted of the heavenly gift** and have been made **partakers of the Holy Spirit**, 5 and have **tasted the good word of God** and the **powers** of the age to come, 6 and *then* have **fallen away**, it is **impossible** to renew them again to **repentance**, since they again **crucify to themselves** the Son of God and put Him to open shame.”

Not impossible – but Hard

- (Hebrews 12:12 – 14) “Therefore, strengthen the hands that are weak and the knees that are feeble, 13 and make straight paths for your feet, so that *the limb* which is lame may not be put out of joint, **but rather be healed**. 14 Pursue peace with all men, and the sanctification without which **no one will see the Lord.**”

Hard to Hang in There – but worth it

- (Hebrews 10:32 – 34)
- “But remember the former days, when, **after being enlightened**, you endured a great conflict of sufferings, 33 partly by being made a public spectacle through reproaches and tribulations, and partly by becoming sharers with those who were so treated. 34 For you showed sympathy to the prisoners and accepted joyfully the seizure of your property, knowing that you have for yourselves a **better possession** and a lasting one.”

Do you Know Jesus, My Lord?

- John 17:1 – 3 “After Jesus said this, he looked toward heaven and prayed: “Father, the hour has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you. 2 For you granted him authority over all people that he might give eternal life to all those you have given him. 3 Now **this is eternal life: that they know you**, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.”
