




POTIPHAR'S VIEW OF JOSEPH

 - The Lord is with...




POTIPHAR'S WIFE'S VIEW

 - She is looking to please herself
 - Prov 5

PROVERBS 5

My son, pay attention to my wisdom; listen closely [a] to my understanding 2 so that you may maintain discretion and your lips safeguard knowledge. ³ Though the lips of the forbidden woman drip honey and her words are [b] smoother than oil, 4 in the end she's as bitter as wormwood and as sharp as a double-edged sword. 5 Her feet go down to death; her steps head straight for Sheol. ⁶ She doesn't consider the path of life; she doesn't know that her ways are unstable. ⁷ So now, sons, listen to me, and don't turn away from the words from my mouth. 8 Keep your way far from her. Don't go near the door of her house. 9 Otherwise, you will give up your vitality to others and your years to someone cruel; 10 strangers will drain your resources, and your hard-earned pay will end up in a foreigner's house. 11 At the end of your life, you will lament when your physical body has been consumed, 12 and you will say, "How I hated discipline, and how my heart despised correction. 13 I didn't obey my teachers or listen closely [c] to my instructors. 14 I am on the verge of complete ruin before the entire community."

Genesis 39:7-20


- A hunk of meat

Genesis 39:7-20


- What did Potiphar's wife see?
 - Someone she did not love
 - Looked good to her eyes
 - Alone
- What did Joseph see?
 - He saw the Lord
 - He recognized his role
 - He wanted to stay pure
 - 1 Tim 4:12. For Potiphar, his wife, himself, and God
 - He needed to run. 1 Cor 10:13





THE JAILER'S VIEW

- He did not sin against God
 - · Where did that lead him?
 - He is in another pit
- Is God still with him?
 - Vs 21. gained favor
 - Vs 22 authority over prison
 - Vs 23 jailer did not bother and everything was successful
 - THE LORD WAS WITH HIM!
- The Jailer saw a trustworthy man
 - Same that Potiphar saw
 - Because the Lord was with him



GOD'S VIEW

Genesis 39

- A strong young man
 - He always did the right thing
 - Vs 9. His main concern
 - We 1st focus on our relationship with God and then others after that
- Young men
 - Be strong
 - Concern ourselves 1st with how God views us
 - Others will see God in us if we let Him in

Joseph and Jesus

Both were beloved sons

Both expressed preludes of future greatness while still in their youth

Both were rejected by their brothers

Both experienced a conspiracy designed to take their life

Both were victims of false witness

Both were stripped of their coat

Each sold for silver

Both were put into a hole in the ground. Each was mourned as dead

Each interacted with two other prisoners.

Both were brought up from the pit

Both rose to the right hand of power

Both would meet first with 10 and then with all 11

Both extend forgiveness to those who betrayed, sold and abandoned them
